

# How USMCA Helps America's Autoworkers

The USMCA will support growth in the auto industry while ensuring that a level playing field protects American jobs and businesses. Major United States automakers, including Ford and General Motors, have offered support for the agreement.

## NEW PROTECTIONS TO SUPPORT AMERICAN AUTO JOBS



The USMCA will keep auto jobs in the United States through improved rules of origin, requiring 75% of auto content to be made in North America.



USMCA will provide stability and certainty for businesses and autoworkers by keeping trade between the United States, Mexico, and Canada free from restrictive trade barriers.



The USMCA will prevent Mexico from undercutting American autoworkers—under the agreement, 40-50% of auto content must be made by higher-earning workers, earning at least \$16 per hour.



USMCA will help prevent American auto jobs from being outsourced to Mexico for cheaper labor and keep more production in the United States.



USMCA includes commitments from Mexico to provide workers the right to collective bargaining if those employees choose.
